Galleywood Youth Club Report: May - July 2024

Main topics of conversation coming up:

- what negative and positive relationships look like
- mindfulness and how to deal with school anxieties, exams friendship troubles etc.
- conversations around sexuality, identity, discussing sexuality with family & friends, feeling accepted, safety in their relationships
- developing confidence and skills

Activities most enjoyed by young people:

- dodgeball/badminton tournaments
- cooking/baking their skills have really improved over the past year which has enabled young people to bake with autonomy rather than being entirely staff led
- Pictionary/puzzle games/brain games like Kahoot and riddles this group really love taking part in group challenges and competitions. They also give their own ideas for new challenges and games to play.
- · Clay modelling

Sign posting:

- This term, youth workers have supported a number of young people through family bereavements. They have really benefitted from being able to speak to youth workers about this. We have also sign posted these young people to specialist bereavement support services. These included online support services as well as phone numbers if they wanted to speak to a professional.
- A number of young people have been signposted to various sources of information, professional support & advice regarding mental health. We sign post young people to the type of support that will suit them best, for example, online chat support, text service, information &advice, phone numbers. This means they know where to access support during the week.









Hiahliahts from this term:

- Huge development in baking and cooking skills from all young people
- The group have really stepped up in terms of working together and taking responsibility, for example designating roles after baking starting the dishwasher, washing up, sweeping, wiping surfaces, etc.
- Healthy, active lifestyles & building skills Since playing badminton at youth club, some attendees have since joined local badminton clubs and play at weekends with their families. Young people enjoy playing badminton at youth club. Since playing badminton in youth club has encouraged some of the young people to join the badminton clubs in their schools or play on weekends with their families.
