Parish Council

Your Parish Council is a local authority that makes some decisions on behalf of the people in the Parish. It is the level of government that is closest to the community in the Chelmsford City Council above it in hierarchy. The Parish Council is often the first place people will go with concerns or ideas and for this reason it is a vital part of the community.

Parish Council Meetings

There are 11 Council Meetings per year held Meetings are held in the Keene Hall. Notice of the meetings, Committee Meetings and Agenda are posted on the village notice board and website about a week in advance. Members of the public are welcome to attend. There is no meeting in August. Details of all Committee meetings can be found on our website.

Parish Council Responsibilities

The Parish Council is responsible for maintaining the green spaces at Twitten Green, The Spinney, and the War Memorial site. Roads, footpaths, grass verges are the responsibility of Essex County Council.

GALLEYWOOD - A Short History

Galleywood is a parish within the City of Chelmsford in the County of Essex. It is contained entirely within the Metropolitan Green Belt and consists mainly of intensively farmed arable land, interspersed with orchards and a few small patches of woodland. The rural part of the parish, including Galleywood Common, is large in area compared with the tightly bounded defined settlement.

The village dates to early medieval times and was recorded in 1250 as Gaulewode, a hamlet of Great Baddow.

The main expansion came in the 20th century. Council housing was developed in the 1930's with major building programmes in the 1960's and 1970's. Private development was carried out concurrently and continues to the current day.

The civil parish of Galleywood now covers an area of 2,200 acres and was established with the transfer of responsibility from Great Baddow to the newly created Galleywood Parish Council in 1987.

The 2001 census recorded a population of 5898 across 2436 households. With no major changes since then, it is estimated that there are now some 2,500 households and a population of just over 6,000.

A major and much loved feature of the village is Galleywood Common which comprises 175 acres. It was declared a Local Nature Reserve in 1933 and is registered as common land managed by Chelmsford City Council. Over time, The Common has seen many uses including a golf course, brickworks and racecourse. It also contains the remains of Napoleonic Military earthwork defences. St Michael and All Angels Church also stands on Galleywood Common. It is said that the origin of the term Steeplechase may have come from the Galleywood Racecourse that ran around the Church .
