Parish Councils are statutory bodies and are the first tier of local government. Galleywood Parish Council is made up of 9 Councillors supported by the Clerk and Admin Assistant. The Parish Council receives an income from Chelmsford City Council. This is know as the 'Precept', which residents pay as part of their council tax. Through an extensive range of Powers we provide and maintain a variety of important and visible local services. Your Parish Councillors are volunteers; they do not receive an allowance from the Parish council.

Meetings

The Parish Council meets at least every other month and it is at these meetings where decisions are made. Meetings are open to the public and there is an opportunity for residents to ask questions about agenda items. 


Personnel Committee - considers the levels of staffing; reviews staffing policies, including training needs.
