What a time it has been, with community buildings and businesses having to close for months on end, children not at school and many people working from home and adjusting to a different life. We have all had our own personal challenges to deal with through this very difficult time, but there is light at the end of the tunnel. Vaccinations being rolled out and the Government's 'Road out of Lockdown' will hopefully be the start of life returning to some form of normality.

A message from your vicar, Revd David Cattle

"Remembering Prince Philip"

Lots will have been said about Prince Philip in recent days, and I thought I would add my own brief thoughts.

Prince Philip has been at the Queen's side for the whole of my life. He is part of the fabric of the country and the Commonwealth. As Prince Andrew recently said, he is like the grandfather of the nation. He actually reminds me of my own grandpa who died a few years ago. And like my grandpa, Philip was a forthright man who sometimes said something that got him in trouble. Nevertheless his contribution to our nation and to the world is immense.

I admire Philip's humility. When he married the young Princess Elizabeth in 1947, he knew what he was letting himself in for – he knew that she would one day be Queen, and that his primary role in life would then be to support her. He sacrificed his own ambitions, for example in his naval career, in order to do this. And what an important role he played – the Queen could not have done what she has done, if she had not been able to rely on Philip's faithfulness over the years.

In this sense Prince Philip reminds of John the Baptist. Before Jesus started his public ministry 2,000 years ago, John prepared the way for him by preaching in the wilderness and baptising people in the River Jordan, as a way of helping them to return to faith in God. But John knew that it was his role to step aside so that Jesus could take centre stage. John has been appreciated by Christians ever since for the part he played, just like Prince Philip will be.

Another thing I admire about Philip is how he made the best of the life he lived. No doubt he was frustrated at times by being part of the royal family, and the constraints that the

institution placed upon him, but he made the best of his position to do a huge amount of good in the world. For example, the inception of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award has helped about 6 million 15-25-year-olds, many with disabilities, to challenge themselves and reach their potential, since its inception in 1956.

This is a reminder to all of us that we might not like everything about our lives, we might not have the freedom to live as we would wish, but life is still a gift from God, and with God's help we can make the best of it in order to bless others.

Our thoughts and prayers are with Her Majesty the Queen and her family at this time. And I know that the Queen will take comfort from her Christian faith, that life carries on after death. Christians believe this because we believe that God raised Jesus from death on that first Easter Sunday, showing that death is not the end. As I say at funeral services, Christian belief gives us the hope that we will meet our loved ones again some day, in the warmth and love of Almighty God.

So thank you Philip, for everything you gave to us. May you rest in peace and rise in glory.

Spring update from Parklands Farm

It is a delight to see so many people on our footpaths at Parklands

Farm again this spring.

Only the very hardiest of souls waded through the mud back in the winter, but now things are drier and the lambs have arrived we are seeing many walkers, runners, horse riders and cyclists back on the farm tracks. Visitors say how they value having the countryside on their doorstep. Everyone in Galleywood is just a few minutes away from a footpath, whether it is on the farm here or perhaps on Galleywood Common. Getting outside for exercise is a great tonic for mind and body and it is free!

Back in Spring 2020 we introduced our lockdown learning logs. These are notes tacked on to logs which are scattered around the farm and give a bit of detail of what is in front of you. They seem to have gone down well and we will update and refresh them. It is my view that everyone should know about how their food is produced and I think it is up to us as farmers to be accountable to you and give you an insight to what we do and why we do it. After all, it might be our farm, but it is everybody's countryside.

My son Hew and I farm in quite a different way to my great grandfather Ernest Howard when he migrated here from Lancashire in the late 1800s, but in fact we are going back to some of the methods Ernest would be familiar with. For a start we have re-introduced sheep, but with a twist. Great grandfather Ernest would have earned good money from the wool he sheared off his sheep. We do not shear our sheep, they shear themselves. They are a self-shedding breed called Exlana. The breed has been developed to self- shed simply because there is too much wool in the world. It would cost us more to pay the shearer than the value of the wool per head.

Our sheep produce grass fed, slow grown succulent meat with a low carbon footprint.

They never eat anything but grass and other green crops around the farm which we grow in between crops such as bread making wheat, barley for beer, borage and linseed for oil. We have a much more diverse landscape now compared to just ten years ago when it would have been just wheat and oilseed rape in the fields. We also have areas for wildlife. You may have seen our wild bird mix areas full of sunflowers and other seeds for birds, or our wildflower areas to encourage good habitat for insects.

Our aim is to work with nature and reduce our reliance on fossil fuels, chemicals and manufactured fertiliser. We are delighted to see the benefits with a good population of hares, yellow hammers, green woodpeckers, field fares, owls, badgers and bats to name a few species. Keep visiting, you never know what you might spot.

HRH Prince Philip



Community Speedwatch

In October 2020, The Galleywood Village Gateway signs were updated to show that Galleywood is a: "COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH VILLAGE".


Community Speed Watch is a traffic monitoring scheme, coordinated by the Essex Fire and Rescue Service (EPCRS) and supported by SERP, but managed and run by volunteers in the community.

By increasing the existing methods of education, recruiting and involving local volunteers, Community Speed Watch benefits the communities themselves by helping to reduce anti-social behaviour and the number of injuries from road traffic collisions.

In February 2021, Essex Road traffic accidents resulted in 1 person killed and 34 people injured. In addition Essex Police reported 30 mobile phone, 63 Drink Driving, 114 Drug driving and 257 seat belt offences.

Local Neighbourhood Action Panel (NAP) meetings have identified excess speed as an important issue for local communities and it is a known significant contributory factor in many road traffic collisions.

More than 95 Community Speed watch groups are now operating across the Essex Police area, providing regular monitoring of vehicle speeds within their own locations. Results are forwarded via log sheets to The Casualty Reduction Unit for processing and warning letters sent to the registered keepers of the vehicles monitored travelling in excess of the posted speed limit. In 2021, the Essex Police Roads Processing Unit will increase generation of warning letters to drivers of up to 30,000 per year via a full time Community Speed Watch Police Administrator.



All volunteers are required to attend quality assured training provided by trainers from SERP which comprises of a presentation followed by a roadside activity.

Each group is allocated a speed recording device which they are required to test prior to each session. Every device is calibrated annually as per manufacturer guidelines. All volunteers are required to wear hi-vis jackets and display signs approximately 100 metres (at a safe pre-assessed site) either side of the monitoring location.

The benefits of Community Speed Watch include:

- The opportunity for residents to increase road safety in their area and support activities to reduce road traffic collisions and injuries
- Enhancing the role of community members as volunteers and developing better links with the community
- Raising awareness of anti-social road use among who use them in local areas

Welcome to Galleywood Parish Council's Annual Report. This summarises the work of the Council for the last financial year. At the time of writing, the UK was in lockdown due to Covid-19 pandemic. The Parish Council offices were temporarily closed and public meetings were being held remotely.

Parish Councils are statutory bodies and are the first tier of local government. Galleywood Parish Council is made up of 9 Councillors supported by the Clerk and Deputy Clerk.

The Parish Council receives an income from Chelmsford City Council, the 'Precept' which residents pay as part of their council tax.

Through an extensive range of Powers we provide and maintain a variety of important and visible local services.

Considers the levels of staffing; reviews staffing policies, including training needs.





Smoky sweet potato burgers with roasted garlic cream and avocado

Makes: 4 burgers. Prep time: 45 mins.Cook time: 10 mins. Total time: 55 mins.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups coarsely mashed sweet potatoes, or yams, about 2 large potatoes
- · 2 bulbs of roasted garlic
- 1 cup cannellini beans, rinsed and drained if canned
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/3 cup panko breadcrumbs
- 1/3 cup oat flour, or all-purpose, wheat, etc
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1 1/2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon cumin
- · 2-3 tablespoons olive oil
- · 1 avocado, sliced
- · 2/3 cup plain greek yogurt or sour cream
- 1 teaspoon maple syrup,
- extra salt and pepper for seasoning yogurt/ cream
- 4 whole wheat buns

INSTRUCTIONS

- Roast the garlic in a medium oven with a sprinkling of oil.
- Pierce potatoes all over with a fork and place on a paper towel, setting in the microwave.
 Microwave for 5 minutes, then flip and cook for 5 minutes more. Remove, slice in half and let cool until you can scoop out the flesh.
- In a large bowl, coarsely mash beans with a fork. Add in sweet potato and mash together, then add in spices, salt and pepper, minced garlic, egg, panko and flour. Mix together until combined, then place bowl in the fridge for 15-20 minutes. This helps form them into patties, but as a warning they are still somewhat messy.
- While mixture is chilling, combine yogurt/ sour cream with 2 bulbs (squeezed out) of roasted garlic cloves, maple syrup and a sprinkle of salt and pepper in a blender or food processor. Process until smooth then set aside until ready to use.

- Heat a large frying pan over medium heat and add 2 tablespoons olive oil.
- Remove mixture from fridge and form into 4 equal patties, then place in the skillet once



hot. Since the mixture can be wet and messy, do not move until they are fully cooked and golden on one side! This takes about 5-6 minutes. Then, add more oil if needed (this really helps cook them) and flip burgers very gently. Cook for another 5-6 minutes. Toast buns if desired.

 Assemble by topping burgers with roasted garlic cream and avocado! You can also consider using caramelized red onions as an additional topping.

Wildlife Wellness Project

Galleywood Parish Council recently negotiated a grant from the Essex County Council Locality Fund for several bird and wildlife boxes as part of the 2020/21 Action Plan - Wildlife Wellness Project.

The local environmental group (tEG) was asked to install the boxes at sites owned by the Parish Council. As the units were gifted into the community, tEG also worked directly with other landowners at identified key sites throughout the village.



Having filled our tool store at Parklands Farm with the boxes we then investigated the best way to install them using information from the RSPB and other specific sites.

We discovered that birds are quite fussy about where their boxes should be placed. Height above ground, which direction they should face, with an open aspect or foliage cover, a busy or quiet area, so we had to consider quite a lot of information.



The most difficult boxes to locate were the Tawny Owl boxes. These were big and heavy and needed to be 5m high on a 45-degree sloping branch. They also needed shade from direct sun and prevailing winds with the opening end of the

box visible to passing Tawny Owls so that they could discover a new home.

We discovered from on-line comments that the design of the box provided recommended that two boxes should be installed close together, one for the family and the second for the male bird.

tEG has installed a total of 46 bird boxes, 3 hedgehog houses, 3 frog & toad abodes and 10 bee/bug hotels. 17 were installed at Twitten Green, 7 in The Spinney, 14 at the Galleywood Heritage Centre, 11 at St Michael and All Angels' Church, 1 at the Keene Hall and 12 within the wildlife area shared by the Galleywood Infant School and St Michael's CE (VA) Junior School.







Take a walk around the village and see how many you can find.
