





A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

From Halloween to Christmas

At the time I am writing this, Halloween has just passed. The journey from Halloween to Christmas feels a bit like a journey from death to life.

Halloween means different things to different people. Some people use it to celebrate superstition and the occult (which, as a Christian, I would definitely not recommend), but most of us see it as a harmless bit of fun. On the Isle of Man, where I come from, we have a tradition called Hop-tu-Naa, which is far older than the American import called "trick-or-treat". It is associated with the ancient Celtic pagan festival of Samhaim which marks the beginning of winter. Children get dressed up in Halloween costume and go from house to house singing traditional songs about Jinny the Witch, and the Witches of Halloween (which are the unliest witches you have ever seen, apparently!). And we used to make turnip lanterns, until pumpkins took over (those Americans again!). All great fun when I was young.

In Christian tradition, Halloween is often called All Hallows Eve. It is the night before All Saints Day (1st Nov) when we remember that no Christian is truly alone, but is always part of a body of people who follow Jesus, both alive and dead. And the day after that is All Souls Day (2nd Nov), when we remember Christians who have died. So maybe it's not surprising that at Halloween we become a nation fascinated by death, and people get dressed up as ghosts, ghouls, skeletons, zombies, etc. Doing this is a way of poking fun at death, and saying "ha ha, you haven't got me yet!" This is a way of dealing with the idea of death, to help ourselves feel a bit better about it.

But Christmas is all about life – the life of the precious child who was born in a stable and laid in a manger, Jesus. He was called "son of man", which highlights that he was genuinely human (one of us), and he was called "son of God", which hints that there is also something

divine about him. This birth is a thing of wonder, and so is this Person.

Even more than I enjoyed Halloween as a child, I enjoyed Christmas – the carols, the presents, and the joy of Christmas Eve as we wait to celebrate the birth of Jesus in the morning. When Jesus was born, God joined himself forever to humanity. Whatever darkness we face in our lives or in the wider world, God is right here with us, to bring us his eternal light.

Many churches have what is called "Light Parties" at Halloween, which celebrate the victory of light over darkness. In this way, they look forward to Christmas when that Light came into the world as a tiny baby. As John's Gospel puts it: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it"

This Christmas, please feel welcome to join us at one of our services or events, as we celebrate the Light that can't be put out.

Galleywood Heritage Centre

Galleywood Heritage Centre, a registered charity, was opened in November 2009.



The building which is located on Galleywood Common off Margaretting Road, is a conversion of the 1920s grandstand from the hey days of horse racing.

The archives, held in the Heritage Room, include information on the history of the racecourse, St Michael's Church, the Napoleonic defences, golf course and other local features. There is an extensive collection of photographs, of both people and places, and these can be searched and viewed on computer. Whilst the photographs mainly relate to Galleywood these also include surrounding areas such as Great Baddow, Margaretting, Writtle and Chelmsford itself.

Other items include maps of Galleywood, records of various clubs, past copies of both Galleywood and Great Baddow's Parish magazines. There is also a collection of books on Galleywood, Chelmsford and Essex and of general interest.

The Heritage room is usually open to visitors on Tuesdays 1.30-3.30pm and the tea room is open 1pm to 3.30pm Tuesdays, some thursdays and some Sundays

If you are not able to make a personal visit, queries can be sent by e-mail to susan. wilson@galleywoodheritagecentre.org.uk who will endeavour to assist.

Displays are held in the Heritage Room featuring different aspects of Galleywood's history. The programme of illustrated talks will restart in March 2023 and the tea room is open for these and other events. Special exhibitions are also held from time to time.

Details of talks, exhibitions and other events are on the centre's website and Facebook page.. A monthly e-mail newsletter can be requested from the e-mail address below.

Various Fund raising activities are organised by the trustees to assist with both running costs and projects

The Centre's Main hall, Heritage room, Common room and large Marquee in the grounds are also available for hire and a number of activities are offered by the various hirers. 
Galleywood Memories

The following is a excerpt from the 'Viewpoint Magazine' from February 2002.

Galleywood Gardeners' Column

Now I have an allotment! What is an allotment? A parcel of land to till.

I have always lived, worked and played on the land, being a country girl. I was intrigued to read Madeline Howard's piece about Canon Leys garden in the November issue of Viewpoint. I myself moved into Canon Levs farm aged 4 years and roamed its fields and hedgerows, knowing as time went on just where the violets, primroses and peggles (Essex for cowslips) grew. In the stackyard there was a beautiful group of pheasant's eye narcissus. Each spring I couldn't wait to see them coming through and growing again. The pond Madeline writes about used to be three ponds in a row. The lower pond was the one we kids used to play around. One sunny day, my best friend Maurice Hurrell and I (we were about 7 or 8 years old) decided to go for a swim. We had stripped down to all but my little woolly yest which had a ribbon round the neck which unfortunately or fortunately, I could not undo so we went to ask mum for help. Of course mum nearly had a fit and we were banned from the ponds after that. Farmers never had much time for gardening in those days, I suppose they had had enough of working the land all day; although we did have a bit of a vegetable garden, fenced off from the chickens which roamed the farmyard. The ancient privy which Madeline mentions helped to fertilise that vegetable plot! About the time I was 14 years old. I thought I would like a flower garden with a lawn on which I could sun-bathe. The Farmers Weekly was advertising shorts for young ladies, with pictures of glamorous girls lying about sunning themselves. I sent for a pair, but when they came I found they were Land Army Girls' breeches cut down, with the baggy sides left in. Even in these my dad and brothers said I was just flaunting myself! However, that was the start of my gardening.

Keene Hall – 84 years on...

I suspect that there are a number of residents in Galleywood who have passed Keene Hall as they have approached The Eagle crossroads, but who have never been inside; others may have heard about it, but not seen it, whilst a number will be familiar with the building.

For the first few years of living in Galleywood, I confess I knew very little about Keene Hall and I was pleased to accept an invitation to tell you something about its history.

It was built in 1937 thanks to the benevolence of Mrs Lavinia Keene of Carlton House, in Beehive Lane, who left the land and money to the then local authority, to build a village hall. The Hall was officially opened on 19th February 1938, and the ceremony was followed by a concert in which the famous crooner, Monte Rey, performed.

It had barely got going before the Second World War interrupted activities, and comparatively normal life was not resumed until 1946. The war may have ended, but it remained a period of austerity, shortages and rationing, which continued into the next decade. It eventually settled down to become what we see today - a village hall for the people of Galleywood. It was Mrs. Keene's wish that the local authority should manage the Hall, make a charge for its hiring and be financially self-sufficient, which it is today. The years rolled by, and the Hall had a major extension, which included a very spacious kitchen. Charity legislation led to the creation of a registered charity in May 2000, with a mix of nominated Parish Councillor and elected Trustees.

Post-war development saw Mrs. Keene's vision gradually fulfilled. Fast forward to 2022 and Keene Hall is still providing a modern venue for residents and non-residents alike, which is attractive, clean and well organised. It has hosted every kind of celebratory event and its regular hirers have enjoyed its facilities for many years and provided the foundation for its success. Repeat bookings and lack of spaces in the diary suggest we are getting it right. Add to that the monthly village market, exhibitions, plays, the Galleywood pensioners'

Christmas meal and its regular usage as a Polling Station mean there is reason for everyone in the village to use it at some time or another. Last, but not least, it has been the home of the Galleywood Parish Council from its inception in 1987.

In June this year, Queen Elizabeth's Jubilee event was celebrated in Keene Hall with a special lunch for 70 of our senior citizens, and attended by our guest of honour, the late Councillor John Galley and his wife, the Mayor and Mayoress of the City of Chelmsford.

The success of any village hall depends so much on how it is run. We are very fortunate in Galleywood in having a small team, led by Administrator Mrs. Susan Royce, who, with Steve Bullman and John Germaine, make up our staff. These three folk keep the place organized,

looking clean, tidy and a pleasure to visit. Regular meetings by Trustees ensure that we constantly are monitoring what we do, how we do it and how we can improve. As it happens, we have a vacancy for a Trustee at the moment – it's not onerous; we are a friendly bunch, so if you might be interested, do please get in touch (administrator@keenehall.com).

Baddow Village PPG

Baddow Village Surgery – Patient Participation Group

Many residents of Galleywood will be patients at Baddow Village Surgery in Longmead Avenue. The Surgery is rated Good by the Care Quality Commission. It has a patient list of some 14,500 and is open to new patients.

What does the Patient Participation Group PPG do?

Each surgery has its own PPG. A small group of volunteers, our aim is to work with the Practice staff to improve the quality of services to patients. We do this through discussions on what the practice is doing and plans to do as well as coming forward with suggestions based on what we learn from friends and colleagues as well as our own personal experiences of the practice. So for those who are saying 'Just get them to answer the telephone' I am in the same position as you as my health recently has meant I have needed to contact them all too frequently. We provide feedback as a critical friend and can act as a sounding board. We do not take up personal cases or individual complaints for which there is a separate process.

Some practical examples of our work in the last year:

- we publish a fortnightly update available via Email. This covers things like changes to surgery staff, opening hours, wearing masks etc. It also currently give local covid-19 data and short articles on matters on interest across the NHS as well as some longer articles by way of further reading for those interested in a particular topic. The group these are sent to 'Friends of Baddow Village Surgery' includes three parish councils and two local pharmacies. It is free and you can unsubscribe at any time. If you are a patient and interested Email me.
- the telephone system at the surgery is old, not now fit for purpose in the new way surgeries work and due to be replaced next year. We have written a paper 'What the patient wants form a telephone system' which is now part of the process the surgery is using to identify their new system.
- we ran a Dementia patient information event over Zoom where a local Alzheimers

Society expert ran through what it is and isn't, some myths and general information and answered questions from the audience.

• we meet the Practice Manager and a partner every quarter to discuss how things are running and what we can do to help – its our agenda, not theirs, so yes we do feedback what we hear as well as from reading local social media. It is often instructive to hear what it looks like from the other side e.g. receptionists in tears and resigning due to patient aggression.

How the NHS is changing

Even before covid the NHS was making increasing use of technology with online appointment booking and telephony for consultations and reminders. The impact of the pandemic was to greatly accelerate this. Telephone consultations reduce face to face contact and infection risk and can be more convenient for patients too as they do not have to come to the surgery. But there are also times when face to face is appropriate or desired by the patients. Contrary to popular opinion, GP's never stopped seeing patients face to face even at the height of the pandemic. As a PPG however we also make the case not to forget those who are not digitally able. For example if all appointments were bookable online, non internet users would seldom get a look in, clearly not acceptable as many of the most frequent users of the surgery are old and frail.

The team of clinicians at surgeries is expanding, there are now Advanced Nurse Practitioners (many of whom can prescribe), pharmacists (who undertake medicine reviews) and social prescribers (who help with broader health issues) as well as the traditional complement of GP's and nurses. Often these additional staff work across groups of several practices (Primary Care Networks - PCN) where one practice alone does not need a full time role. Baddow Village is part of the Chelmsford City Health PCN which includes Stock, Whitley and Beauchamp House surgeries. As a result receptionists have now taken on a 'care navigation' role to help get you to the right specialist who may not be a GP. They will ask some questions to allow them to do this. No

they are not qualified clinicians but they are not diagnosing the patient, just getting them speak to the best placed person to help. It is no longer necessary to see the more highly skilled GP for simple things like a blood pressure check. Their precious time resource are needed for the more complex cases. So please do understand if you are asked - what is the matter? - and accept that seeing the GP may not be the answer.

The pressures on GP Practices

It is not news that practices are under great pressure. The reasons for this are many but boil down to two things supply and demand. Some 90% of all contact with the NHS is via your local practice, yet less that 10% of the spend goes there. Over many years investment in training GP's (which takes 10 years) and other clinicians, premises and other services has fallen below the numbers needed. On the demand side there are now many more treatments available and we are living longer and with more long term conditions. There is also a view that our expectations have increased. The result is demand exceeding supply and that was before covid which brought its own problems with for example people who would have had hospital treatment still awaiting this with the burden until then left with the local GP GP's will tell

you they have never been so busy.

So whats to be done?

There are several things here:

- firstly for us all to recognise we are the primary person responsible for our health. So for example if we choose to ignore advice to have the flu vaccine, should we expect the NHS to pick up the pieces if we get flu?
- we all need to understand the staff are doing their best in a difficult situation. Getting angry or spending 5 minutes complaining of how long it took to get through will not help anyone, especially those waiting.
- when you see a clinician have your facts and any questions ready. Use their/your precious time carefully.
- practices are getting more specialist staff, see above, however GP numbers are not rising and few expect them to in the foreseeable future. The bigger worry is that many leave having had enough.
- use your local pharmacy in Galleywood. Nik and his team can help and advise on many conditions.
- there are initiatives aimed to increase availability although they often depend on GP's giving up extra time see below. This is not easy as the working day is 8.00am 6.30pm and I know they are often working much later than that and at weekends. >

Tree Management within Galleywood

The Parish Council receives quite a few enquiries regarding the management of trees around the Village.

The first thing we have to do is establish who owns the land the tree sits on. This is because it is the landowner who is responsible for the tree.

There are a number of different potential landowners:

- A private landowner, if the tree is in someone's garden
- Essex County Council, if the tree is on a verge next to a footpath or road
- Chelmsford City Council, if the tree is in a park or play area
- A private management company, if the tree is part of a complex of flats
- Chelmer Housing Partnership, if the tree is part of a social housing property they own

To find out who owns a piece of land, an enquiry would need to be made to the Land

Registry. There is a charge for this service.

Regardless of whether a tree is protected or not, the owner is responsible for maintaining it and there is no statutory rules setting out how often or to what standard. Owners should ensure their trees remain safe and healthy and arrange for them to be regularly inspected and necessary maintenance carried out.

Chelmsford City Council has a Tree Management Policy which sets out their approach to managing trees on their land and their statutory duties
