

I am also pleased to report that Chelmsford City Council are running the Love Your Parish Days for 2023. The Parish Council have arranged with the City Council for their Street Care Service team to spend time in Galleywood on 22nd June 2023.

As I am sure you will agree, these provisions will give a positive boost to our parish and show our commitment to keeping Galleywood a clean and pleasant place to live, work and play.

Local Elections took place on 4 May 2023 which has resulted in a couple of changes in Parish Councillor representations. The first Annual Council meeting took place on Tuesday, 16 May 2023. At this meeting, Parish Councillors signed their declarations of acceptance of office and elected Councillor Troop as Chairman and Councillor Potter as Vice-Chairman. The Annual Parish Meeting - This year the meeting will take place on 31 May 2023 from 6pm, at The Heritage Centre. Along with the Parish Council's Annual Report and presentation from the Chairman, we will have guest speakers from St Michaels Junior School and Galleywood Social Club.

The competition winner of the front cover of the May 2023 Grapevine edition will also be presented with a certificate and gift by the Chairman during the evening.

to carry out activities for the benefit of Galleywood parishioners. The Parish Council awarded a total of £1850 to four local organisations that applied for a grant in September 2022. A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

I am writing this a few days before the Coronation of King Charles III. The Coronation is a very special moment in the life of our nation, and there will be celebrations all around our country and indeed all around the world. I know that it is also a controversial thing – there are many people who find the whole idea of a hereditary monarchy to be a complete waste of time and money. They might ask why we are making such a fuss over this one rich, privileged chap, who is actually just as human as the rest of us.

Granted that the idea of monarchy is not perfect, and granted that the members of the royal family are far from perfect, I will be celebrating when Charles is crowned. For three reasons:

Firstly, the monarchy in the form that we now have it is not so much about the individuals concerned, as about the nation. The monarchy is one of those things that holds us together as a nation. The coronation is an opportunity to celebrate all that is good about our country, like its democracy, rule of law and peace, and to say that we are committed to each other, to live well together and care for each other. The UK is not perfect, to be sure, but when I compare this country with many places in the world, I feel very fortunate to live here.

Secondly, I can see the monarchy's potential for good. When the members of the royal family get it right, they can be a huge force for good in the world, by their charity work, their peace-making diplomacy, and the example they set for others. Primarily, they are there to serve us, the public, and they are accountable to us for how they perform their duties. When Queen Elizabeth II died, I led special assemblies in our schools in Galleywood, and I could talk about her selfless dedication to duty. Yes, her life was rich and privileged, but it was also lived in the service of other people. That's a great example to follow.

Thirdly, the Coronation service at Westminster Abbey is a Christian service (I know this is also controversial, but stay with me!), which recognises that King Charles III is, in fact, only human, and that his reign as King is served under the authority of the true King – Jesus himself. This relativizes the power and position of all earthy kings, queens, and rulers of any kind – no matter who they are, no matter how powerful, they are all accountable to a Higher Power who sees right through them (God is never fooled by show-offs, narcissists or 'spin doctors'). The whole service reminds Charles of this, and warns him never to abuse the power he holds.

Jesus is a King who does not rule by power or manipulation, and he is not interested in wealth, privilege or making himself look good. Instead, he rules by the power of love – he came to serve, not to be served. He knows that in the end, the power of love is the only power that matters. So, Charles will say in the Coronation service: "In His name and after His example, I come not to be served but to serve."

Many of us, myself included, will say the words of homage to King Charles (the first time these words have been used at a Coronation service): "I swear that I will pay true allegiance to Your Majesty, and to your heirs and successors according to law. So help me God." ...knowing that he is accountable to both God and us, and praying that he, in his own flawed humanity, will in fact follow the example of Jesus in all things.



Welcome to Galleywood Parish Council's Annual Report. This summarises the work of the Council for the last financial year.

Councillor Richard Hyland, Chairman Galleywood Parish Council

Parish Councils are statutory bodies and are the first tier of local government. Galleywood Parish Council is made up of 9 Councillors supported by the Clerk and Admin Assistant. The Parish Council receives an income from Chelmsford City Council, the 'Precept' which residents pay as part of their council tax. Through an extensive range of Powers we provide and maintain a variety of important and visible local services.

Meetings

The Parish Council meets on a monthly basis (except for August) and it is at these meetings where decisions are made. Meetings are open to the public and there is an opportunity for residents to ask questions regarding items on the agenda. Personnel Committee - considers the levels of staffing; reviews






