Galleywood Heritage Centre

Galleywood Heritage Centre, a registered charity, was opened in November 2009.

The building which is located on Galleywood Common off Margaretting Road, is a conversion of the 1920s grandstand from the hey days of horse racing.

The archives, held in the Heritage Room, include information on the history of the racecourse, St Michael's Church, the Napoleonic defences, golf course and other local features. There is an extensive collection of photographs, of both people and places, and these can be searched and viewed on computer. Whilst the photographs mainly relate to Galleywood these also include surrounding areas such as Great Baddow, Margaretting, Writtle and Chelmsford itself. Other items include maps of Galleywood, records of various clubs, past copies of both Galleywood and Great Baddow's Parish magazines. There is also a collection of books on Galleywood, Chelmsford and Essex and of general interest.

The Heritage room is usually open to visitors on Tuesdays 1.30-3.30pm and the tea room is open 1pm to 3.30pm Tuesdays, some Thursdays and some Sundays

If you are not able to make a personal visit, queries can be sent by e-mail to **susan.** wilson@galleywoodheritagecentre.org.uk who will endeavour to assist.

Displays are held in the Heritage Room featuring different aspects of Galleywood's history. The programme of illustrated talks will restart in March 2024 and the tea room is open for these and other events. Special exhibitions are also held from time to time.

Details of talks, exhibitions and other events are on the centre's website and Facebook page. A monthly e-mail newsletter can be requested from the e-mail address below.

Various Fund raising activities are organised by the staff and volunteers to assist with both running costs and projects






Bright's Life - so Far - so Good

It's a long time ago - don't go there some might say - but memories are always flooding back.

My 26 years in Galleywood are full of them in spite of having lived in many other places since then. From watching German Luftwaffe Bombers flying past on their way to bomb London, there were the "dog fights" - possibly Spitfires versus Messerschmitt fighter planes making large circles in the sky over towards Stock. Happily we were missed, apart from a piece of shrapnel which lodged in our roof and the repaired slates still show where! Talking of the house: there is a large white block in the upper side of the brick work showing the date "1873" and location. See it in the photo - the red marker is between the shrapnel damage and the stone block. Moving on to nicer things: my dad, Ted Bright, made the front garden a magnificent show of red dahlias, white allisiam and blue lobelias. Of course, both front and rear gardens were three times larger then, Mum, Kitty Bright, and me tended the very large back garden in the war to be self sufficient for food.

At that time my mother helped at St. Michael's church by operating the bellows for the organ during the service so we sat at the front to go to the back of the organ easily. When my time came to be called up to the RAF in 1957 I began a farewell to Galleywood, or so I thought. The RAF had other ideas which meant that I was stationed at Stradishall for most of 2 years and could cycle home frequently. However, I did move away, to Devon, for 2 years before returning home. It was pleasant to be back. I picked up church bellringing again, never very good, but had fine, patient, tutorials in change ringing from Bert Bartholomew in the tower captain Bill Barrett's home in The Street over a few glasses of carrot wine. Alas, it was not to a permanent homecoming, job opportunities called me away and marriage intervened! From then life seemed to speed up - children and jobs overseas saw to that.





A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

I wonder what Christmas will be like in Bethlehem this year.

Bethlehem, the place where Jesus was born around 2,000 years ago, is in the piece of land known as the West Bank, which is one of the two Palestinian territories (the other territory is the Gaza Strip, where there is currently a full-scale war going on). Tourism forms the main part of the Bethlehem's economy, especially at Christmas when Christian pilgrims flock to the Church of the Nativity, which is thought to be the place where Jesus was born.

When I went to Bethlehem a few years ago, we had to pass through a military check-point to get there. It was a scary thing to have our minibus stopped and checked by teenagers with machine guns.

The conflict between Israelis and Palestinians is desperately sad, and very complicated, with a long history. I wonder what God thinks of it all. You might wonder why, in the land where the Prince of Peace was born and lived, his message of peace hasn't been embraced more strongly.

I wonder what Christmas will be like in your home this year. Christmas is supposed to be a really happy time, and for many of us, thankfully, it will be. But Christmas can also be a sad time. Many of us miss our loved ones who have died even more at this time of year. We hold the memories of Christmases past, and we wish our loved ones were still with us, to celebrate with us. This is especially true for those who have experienced recent, unexpected loss.



And I wonder what the first Christmas was like. 2,000 years ago. What we now call the "Holy Land" was under Roman military occupation at the time, and puppet kings like Herod the Great kept control of the population by dishing out harsh violence, which led to flare-ups of violent disorder and the occasional all-out war. And then there were the personal struggles faced by Jesus' family - a pregnancy outside of marriage, a long journey while pregnant, a birth in a stable, and King Herod's attempt to try to kill the infant Jesus.

So, maybe this is the point of Christmas: God knows all about our human sins and fears that lead people to war, he knows all about our human struggles with loss and pain, and he still wants to meet with us by becoming human in the Person of Jesus Christ (the great mystery of the incarnation). God knew full well that he wasn't coming into a world where everything was nice and happy. God knew that to meet us where we are meant that he would need to enter into, and embrace, human weakness and suffering, and even death.

This means that God isn't just interested in us when times are good, but also when times are hard. Into the very worse situations, God breathes his hope and light.

For me, the Christmas story is comforting. Not just because it evokes childhood memories of family Christmases, but also because it tells me that God cares about the world and about me. In a time of darkness, for anyone looking for light and hope, please do join us at one of our services this Christmas. You won't find easy answers, but you might just find Someone who cares.

May God bless you this Christmas and always.

Chelmsford City Council's new Green Dog Walkers Scheme provides a simple, non-confrontational, and community-driven way to tackle dog fouling.

The scheme encourages dog walkers to come together to tackle the problem, by carrying extra dog poo bags and sharing them with those who may have been caught short. Rather than criticising someone for not picking up after their dog, Green Dog Walkers group members simply provide a solution without judgment or confrontation.

Those who sign up to the scheme receive free dog poo bags and a Green Dog Walkers badge or armband, so that fellow dog walkers can identify them and ask for a bag if they need to.

Whilst dog fouling is unpleasant and harmful, it is also a criminal offence to fail to pick up after your dog, yet it continues to be an issue. Chelmsford City Council have decided to try a different tack in the form of the Green Dog Walkers scheme.

Sign up to be a Green Dog Walker

All dog walkers are invited to sign up to the Green Dog Walkers scheme. In doing so, they pledge to:

- Wear a badge as often as possible when walking their dog
- At all times clean up after their dog and dispose of the bag in a bin

- Carry extra dog bags and be happy to be approached to give a dog bag to those who require one
- Be a friendly reminder to other dog walkers to clean up after their dog

Every volunteer will receive a welcome pack, which includes:

- Welcome letter, with a copy of the pledge
- Green Dog Walkers badge
- A roll of poo bags in a dispenser

If you are a victim of crime or see a crime taking place. Please REPORT it.

Best methods of communication with Chelmsford and Maldon Community Policing Team would be to send an email to **CandMCPT@essex.police.uk**. The other methods of contact would be online, via **101** or in an emergency to dial **999**.

In an emergency Call 999 if:

- a serious offence is in progress or has just been committed
- someone is in immediate danger or harm
- property is in danger of being damaged
- a serious disruption to the public is likely

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use textphone service **18000** or text on **999** if you've pre-registered with the emergencySMS service.

Silent 999 calls -If you're in danger but you can't talk on the phone, you should still call **999**

Call 101 for non-emergency enquiries.

Should I communicate on social media?

- Alert your neighbours: By sharing your story, you can help raise awareness about the crime you experienced, which may lead to increased public attention and support for your cause.
- **2. Warning:** By sharing your crime story, you can alert your neighbours to suspicious persons/activity
- Seeking justice: Media coverage can help bring attention to your case and potentially lead to new evidence or witnesses coming forward.
- 4. Supporting others: Sharing your story can provide support and encouragement to others who have experienced similar crimes.

However, it's important to consider the potential risks and consequences of sharing your story. Media attention can be overwhelming and may expose you to unwanted scrutiny or even retaliation. It's crucial to carefully weigh the potential benefits against the potential risks and make an informed decision that feels right for you.



Trauma Survivors Across Essex Launch Film

Healthwatch Essex have launched a film produced in collaboration with our Trauma Ambassador Group showing the impact a cervical screening can have on those who live with the effects of trauma.

With nearly 1 in 3 people not attending their cervical screening appointments, the Healthwatch Essex Trauma Ambassador Group (TAG) recognised a need for sharing the unique challenges that trauma survivors may experience. Working with the group, Healthwatch Essex produced a short film in a clinical environment to demonstrate the trigger-points for trauma survivors and educate professionals on how appointments can be improved to make patients more comfortable.

Staff at Beacon House in Colchester kindly provided the space for an ambassador to walk through the process of a cervical screening appointment with a nurse, Michelle, demonstrating a number of trigger-points within an appointment, ranging from the language used, to the setup of the room and the often-rushed feel of an appointment. One of the main suggestions for trauma survivors from the ambassadors included holding and using the Healthwatch Essex Trauma Card.

Della is a member of the Trauma Ambassador Group. She was instrumental in the creation of the film, and features in it: "Too often women are given scare tactics around cervical screening "you could die" type comments and data. We know that already.

We need to be heard and supported and have trauma informed clinics available or a Trauma Card that is understood by practitioners."

Sharon Westfield-de-Cortez, Healthwatch Essex Information and Guidance Manager, created the Trauma Ambassador Group. She said: "We understand that everyone is unique, and that other factors may influence people's feelings around the screening process, such as having experienced domestic abuse or female genital mutilation, and that these can create additional barriers. We would encourage anyone in this situation to contact the surgery or clinic they will be accessing to request a conversation about this prior to the procedure, so that they can ask the questions you need to and receive appropriate reassurance. It's really important that trauma survivors remain engaged with health services to receive the care that they need and are entitled to."

The excellent examples highlighted in the toolkit show how this can be achieved and we hope it inspires organisations and communities across Essex to get involved in the intergenerational movement.


Councillor Tony Ball, Cabinet Member for Education Excellence, Lifelong Learning and Employability, said:

Search and Rescue Dog Bailey special feature in a book for Dogs Trust

A Search and Rescue Dog from Essex County Fire and Rescue Service (ECFRS), specialising in live scent search has been featured in The Little Dog That Laughed book for the Dogs Trust.

Being described as unruly, untrainable, and unsociable, Bailey was taken in by the Dogs Trust in Loughborough back in 2021.

After spending some time with Bailey, the team at the Dogs Trust saw that he had potential. The charity contacted the UK International Search and Rescue (UKISAR) and other services to ask if anyone was looking for a new search dog.

Graham Currie, who is a Watch Manager and Dog Handler for the Service said: "I'd been looking for a dog for just under a year when I saw the plea from the Dogs Trust. So, I went up to Loughborough the following day to see what Bailey was like. After testing his drive for a tennis ball and checking he had no aggression towards other dogs or people, I offered to take him on a six-week trial."

Now two years on, Graham describes Bailey as the most natural search and rescue dog, and his inspiring story has been featured in The Little Dog that Laughed book for the Dogs Trust.

Graham adds: "Bailey was quite a handful to begin with, as he had little to no training and was very head strong. The biggest challenge was, as I call them now his 'Fenton moments', chasing rabbits or deer and disappearing over the horizon. But some Primula cheese spread, and a lot of patience has seen Bailey turn his life around.

"This year Bailey achieved his full license, not just for the UK but for UK International Search and Rescue too. His training is always continuing to ensure he stays at the top of his game.

"Bailey has fallen on his feet and has got a purpose in life and who knows how many lives he may save over his career."

A spokesperson from the Dogs Trust said: "From the first time Bailey arrived at Dogs Trust Loughborough, it was clear that he was destined for greatness.

"Initially found as a stray, he quickly adapted to life at Dogs Trust and successfully passed all his tests. Bailey's hard work and unwavering resilience has landed him a job at the Essex Country Fire and Rescue Service, where he continues to show his determination and goodwill through supporting the local community.

"We hope this story is a frequent reminder of all the purposeful work rescue dogs do and highlights the special bond between humans and our canine friends."

One way to explore what's available to you is by using the Find Your Active Activity Finder, an online tool that helps narrow down the search to a certain area or activity. This tool has a wide range of groups and clubs so you can find what interests you like playing football or getting active in nature!

Local groups and clubs who help others are an inspiration and are an incredible asset to the local community. Whether that's setting up a team supporting residents living with a disability, looking for a way to get active and make friends, to a group that helps young people relax and disengage from daily stresses through movement. The Move With Us campaign recognises how important movement can be for young people. The campaign offers great advice to encourage



increased activity like putting on your favourite song or playlist to motivate you to move! Music and activity can reduce stress and support wellbeing.

Sometimes getting active means more than just physical activity and November's mental health focus should highlight how beneficial activity can be for looking after mental wellbeing. Getting outside with a friend or colleague for a walk can be protected time for a chat that encourage important conversations about how you're doing. November brings focus to men's mental health and recognises how important it is to prioritise mental and physical wellbeing. For men, adding movement into their routine could be the missing puzzle piece to a healthier lifestyle because this is dedicated time to support their mental health. Seeing the benefits of added movement and protected time for wellbeing activities can encourage men to maintain this routine and also invite others to join their journey.

Mental health issues affect us all and that's why it's important to encourage people to use physical activity to boost the positive hormones associated with movement to feel more confident and happier. The Able like Mabel campaign recognises this and promotes gentle exercises that not only build strength and resilience in older residents but make them feel more positive as many may be facing isolation.
