

Galleywood Bulb Planting

On Saturday 25th November 2023 Parish Councillors Anthony McQuiggan and Chris Shreeve supported a group of volunteers in a bulb planting day.

Galleywood Parish Council purchased over 3000 bulbs, with approximately 800 crocus and narcissus tête-à-tête bulbs being planted in the green spaces around the entrance to the Galleywood shops car park. It was a dry, bright, but chilly day so many thanks to our volunteers – Mrs Susan Rawlingson, the Egginton family and the Reeves family.

Our gratitude must also be extended to tEG (The Environmental Group) for their guidance with regard to planting on the day, and also for their additional bulb planting sessions which took place over the course of the week. With additional bulb donations, they managed to plant a magnificent 2450 daffodils bulbs, 700 tête-à-tête and Woodland mix along Watchouse Road and around the village.

Growing Galleywood

As Spring returns with green shoots emerging many of us return to outdoor activities.

In Galleywood our village Community has more than 130 individuals and their families who are enthusiastic allotment holders.

We are fortunate to have two spaces to foster a passion for growing in Galleywood, and the Chaplin Close allotment site has been thriving for 103 years. Situated off The Street, The Galleywood Cottage Garden Society has been a place for gardeners of all ages and levels of experience to get outside and have a go at growing a range of edibles and flowers. Due to the foresight of others in the 1920's and the careful management of local people the Society has been able to remain independent of local councils, has developed facilities and welcomed men, women and children over the years with great benefits for the well-being of the environment and participants alike.

Our recent challenges have included changing weather patterns with extremes of rainfall and temperatures requiring plot holders to adapt responsively and creatively to these new conditions. Growing melons outside would once have been considered difficult but now they are often seen on site. More traditional vegetables and salad products familiar and much loved by many continue to be grown in abundance. We deposit excess produce in trays outside the gates, mostly during the summer months, so do feel free to help yourselves as you walk by. Our friends and neighbours can only eat so much cucumber and runner beans!

Collectively we are optimistic, knowledgeable, productive and invariably resilient as we aim to nurture not only our crops but our community.

A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

No pain, no gain!

For those old enough to remember the 1990s –

Gladiators is back on telly! I was a young adult in the 1990s, and still living at home with my parents. Gladiators was our essentially Saturday night tea-time viewing, and it is same in the vicarage today!

For those who have not seen it, the programme features 4 contestants (2 women and 2 men) who compete in various physical activities against a team of Gladiators, who are professional athletes and body-builders (basically big people who are fit, strong and full of muscle). The women compete against Gladiators with names like Dynamite and Electro, and the men against the likes of Giant (who is 6 foot 5) and Apollo (who is 6 foot 6!).

The games include Duel (trying to knock your opponent off a platform using a big padded stick) and The Wall (trying to reach the top of a climbing wall while being chased by an angry Gladiator who wants to pull you off before you reach the top). It's all done safely, with lots of pads, helmets, safety ropes and a referee. And at the end of the programme, after being battered by the Gladiators.

the contestants race

against each other over

an obstacle course to decide which man and woman go through to the next round.

It's not everyone's cup of tea, but I think it's great fun with plenty of laughs. And some of the people who come on the show are really great athletes, just like they were back in the 1990s. After finishing a game, an interviewer often asks them if they enjoyed it, and even though they are out of breath, in pain, and sometimes flat on their back, they always say yes (even if they lost the game!).

It's one example of how pain and joy go together. I don't think these athletes enjoy the pain, but they enjoy the things that the pain earns – the rush of adrenaline, the sense of achievement, the feeling of being alive and of pushing their body to the limit.

In the Church calendar, we are currently in the season of Lent, and we are moving towards that special weekend of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. It is the most important weekend of the year for Christians, and it involves both pain and joy. 2,000 years ago, Jesus entered into the pain of suffering and death by crucifixion at the hands of the Romans, and his followers experienced the pain of losing him. And every Good Friday since then, Christians have entered into this pain by remembering this event (Good Friday is indeed a very sombre day). But on the first



Easter Sunday, Jesus' followers experienced the joy of his resurrection, and every year Christians share this joy as we remember and celebrate the day that death was defeated.

Without the pain of Good Friday, there is no joy of Easter Sunday; just like without the pain of training and competing, athletes don't get the joy of achievement and winning.

Gladiators brings a barrel of laughs to Saturday night telly, but Good Friday and Easter Sunday bring the assurance that God cares for us and is on our side, and the hope that death is not the end but is the gateway to eternal life with God. So, that's my message: Easter is better than Gladiators!

Everyone is welcome to celebrate the most important festival in Christianity with us at St Michael's Church. (See the list of services.)



Spring Flavours Unleashed with our latest recipes

This month's recipes celebrate this season's produce by embracing some locally sourced ingredients!

From vibrant beetroot gratin to a hearty kale and potato hash, we've tried to incorporate some of the town's freshest produce into some family-friendly delights.

Simple, family-friendly, and planet-conscious, these recipes echo the spirit of Galleywood. Let's welcome spring with open hearts and delicious plates!

SPRING CHICKEN STIR-FRY



Ingredients

400g chicken breast, thinly sliced 1 red pepper, thinly sliced 1 yellow pepper, thinly sliced

200g sugar snap peas, ends trimmed

2 carrots, julienned

3 tbsp soy sauce, 1 tbsp honey

1 tbsp ginger, minced

2 cloves garlic, minced

2 tbsp vegetable oil

Sesame seeds for garnish Cooked rice for serving

Instructions

- In a bowl, mix soy sauce, honey, ginger, and garlic. Marinate chicken slices in this mixture for at least 15 minutes.
- **2.** Heat oil in a wok over medium-high heat. Stir-fry marinated chicken until browned.
- **3.** Add peppers, sugar snap peas, and carrots. Stir-fry for 3-4 minutes until vegetables are tender-crisp.
- **4.** Serve the stir-fry over cooked rice. Garnish with sesame seeds.

SPINACH AND FETA STUFFED MUSHROOMS (VEGETARIAN)



Ingredients

16 large mushrooms, stems removed 200g fresh spinach, chopped 150g feta cheese, crumbled 1 small red onion, finely chopped 2 cloves garlic, minced 2 tbsp olive oil Salt and pepper to taste Fresh parsley for garnish

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- In a pan, sauté red onion and garlic in olive oil until softened. Add chopped spinach and cook until wilted.
- In a bowl, mix the spinach mixture with crumbled feta. Season with salt and pepper.
- Stuff each mushroom cap with the spinachfeta mixture.
- **5.** Bake for 15-20 minutes until mushrooms are tender.
- 6. Garnish with fresh parsley before serving.





VEGAN BEETROOT AND CELERIAC GRATIN



Ingredients

2 medium-sized beetroots, peeled and thinly sliced

1 small celeriac, peeled and thinly sliced

1 onion, thinly sliced

400ml coconut milk

2 cloves garlic, minced

2 tbsp nutritional yeast

2 tbsp olive oil

Salt and pepper to taste Fresh thyme for garnish

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
- 2. In a pan, sauté onions and garlic until softened.
- **3.** Layer beetroots, celeriac, and onions in a baking dish.
- **4.** Mix coconut milk, nutritional yeast, olive oil, salt, and pepper. Pour over the vegetables.
- **5.** Bake for 40-45 minutes or until vegetables are tender.
- **6.** Garnish with fresh thyme before serving.

POPULAR KALE AND POTATO HASH



Ingredients

4 medium potatoes, peeled and diced

2 cups kale, chopped

1 onion, finely chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 tsp smoked paprika

1 tsp cumin

Salt and pepper to taste

2 tbsp olive oil

Fresh parsley for garnish

Instructions

- Boil diced potatoes until just tender. Drain and set aside.
- 2. In a pan, sauté onions and garlic in olive oil until translucent.
- **3.** Add boiled potatoes and kale to the pan. Cook until kale is wilted.
- **4.** Sprinkle with smoked paprika, cumin, salt, and pepper. Stir well.
- **5.** Cook for an additional 5 minutes until potatoes are golden.
- **6.** Garnish with fresh parsley before serving.



The arrival of winter weather always sees an increase in complaints about roofing companies targeting elderly or vulnerable consumers in Essex.

Whilst some are unsolicited (where the consumer is approached on their doorstep), there is also a growing trend for rogue traders to appear as legitimate and feature on various 'find a quote' or 'approved trader' websites where the consumer is seeking businesses to quote for a known house maintenance problem.

Once through the door what started as a reasonable quote can quickly escalate once work starts with other 'problems' being found, which may or may not even exist or need to be repaired at all. At this point the consumer is in a vulnerable position with work already underway on the roof, without an opportunity to properly investigate or obtain other quotes and feeling pressured into paying well over the odds.

A very recent case saw a consumer agree to an initial quote for £1,500 to resolve a leak which quickly escalated up to £35,000 for a whole new roof. Part payment was made but thanks to the intervention of our officers and their bank no further payments were made. A surveyor has reported that, even if all the work was necessary, the maximum value would have been no more than £12,000.

Consumers are recommended to use a recognised trader approval scheme such as the Trading Standards approved Buy With Confidence Scheme. Do your research on the business and don't commit to any work without obtaining further quotes and being provided with a comprehensive contract identifying the business, the work required and your cancellation rights.



What to do in the garden in March

By mid-March, we're ready to welcome the start of spring, hopeful, happy time for us gardeners.

There's lots to be done outside, now the slower winter months have passed. Read on to find out more about what gardening jobs there are to do in March:

Timely Tips

- 1. Fertilise your beds. Once your soil is workable, dig a 5cm (or more) layer of compost or well-rotted manure into your beds to prepare for the growing season ahead. You can also work in a generalpurpose fertiliser, such as pelleted chicken manure, or fish, blood and bone.
- 2. Put supports in. If any of your garden plants or climbers need supporting this year, put them in now, so plants can grow up through them. Adding supports afterwards is trickier and often looks unattractive.
- 3. Move deciduous trees or shrubs. Now is the time to do this task, provided the soil isn't frozen or waterlogged.
- 4. Resurface paths before plants start to grow and smother them.

In the flower garden

- · Feed trees, shrubs and hedges with a slowrelease fertiliser by lightly forking it into the soil surface.
- Feed roses with special rose feed or balanced fertiliser as they come into growth. Prune roses now to encourage strong new growth.
- · Finish cutting back dead foliage from perennials and ornamental grasses to make way for new growth.
- Deadhead any winter pansies, daffodils, and hydrangeas.
- · Plant native hedges to encourage wildlife to your garden.

In the vegetable garden

- Dig in green manures grown over the winter. Do this while stems are still soft.
- Dig compost, well-rotted manure or green waste into your vegetable beds to prepare for the growing season ahead. Dig in a 5cm (or more) layer when the soil becomes workable. Weed vegetable seed beds before adding the layer.



- plastic to keep it drier and warmer in preparation for planting.
- Weed and mulch asparagus beds. Asparagus has shallow roots so weed by hand to prevent damage.

In the fruit garden

- Cut autumn-fruiting raspberry canes to the ground to stimulate new canes, which will fruit in the autumn.
- Mulch fruit trees with well-rotted manure or garden compost. Take care not to mound mulch up around tree trunks.
- Cover outdoor strawberries with cloches to encourage earlier fruiting.

Other jobs about the garden

- Recut any lawn edges if necessary.
- Get rid of slimy patches on patios and paving by scrubbing with a broom or blasting with a pressure washer.
- Install water butts for the season ahead. Position them under a downpipe to make the most of rainfall.
- Begin weeding as the weather warms it's easier to control weeds if you remove them while they're still young.

Build a compost bin before the growing season gets underway. If you already have one, check to see if there is any compost ready to use on vegetable beds.

Running is a brilliant way to improve both your physical and mental health, and we have got some top tips to get you running through your New Year's Resolution and beyond!

Find the right shoes

Investing in a good pair of running shoes is paramount to a comfortable run. Your foot size and shape, and where you run are all factors in determining the perfect shoe to make you feel like you're walking on clouds, whether you're taking on the tarmac or hitting the hiking routes. There are great free resources online, but the best thing would be to visit your local running shop and try on a few pairs!

Slow and steady wins the race

There is no need to sprint out of the starting blocks and try to set a personal best. Begin slowly – a brisk walk, or a mixture of running and walking, or short distance are all great ways to start building your stamina and get your body into the rhythm of running.

Set achievable goals

To keep you motivated in the long term why not consider entering a local charity run and give yourself something to train for – plus you'll get a medal for all your hard work!

Use technology

Free apps such as Strava and Couch to 5k are brilliant tools for tracking your runs and aiding your improvement. You can keep these runs completely private, or can share them with the community if you wish – the choice is yours.

Playlists

A good playlist is almost as important as a good pair of shoes. Create something that motivates you to keep moving. Another great way is to search for a BPM playlist on Spotify or Apple Music. This will give you a personalised playlist of songs you love to a specific BPM helping you keep your rhythm and pace.

Community running

Whether it be a local running club, online forum, or friends or family, sharing experiences, tips, and struggles will make running far more enjoyable. Running doesn't need to be a solo event – everyone will cheer you on!

Look after your body

Hydrate, hydrate, hydrate! Before, during, and after a run. Water is key to every run, however once you've built up to longer distances it's important to re-fuel too – consider isotonic running gels for runs over 10k.

And if you need a rest day, take it guilt free. Recovery is important to recuperate, and nothing beats a good night's sleep.


