

I hope many of you will have been able to enjoy the stories, and the opportunity to have a picnic and an ice cream! The second of our summer events is Play in the Park at Jubilee Park and Chelmer Park, with a range of activities for young people. Please let us know if you have enjoyed these activities, and if you would like to continue with these or suggest alternatives for next year.

On June 6th, the Parish Council held a service at the Keene Hall to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings, conducted by the Vicar of St Michaels' Church, the Reverend David Cattle, and including readings by Councillors and the lighting of the Peace Lantern. Refreshments were provided in the Keene Hall afterwards. As in previous years, there will be an Armistice Day service at the Keene Hall on November 11th this year.

On July 6th at the Keene Hall, the Parish Council held its first Galleywood Showcase event, to advertise the many volunteer groups in Galleywood and seek volunteer support from residents. We were very pleased to welcome the Mayor of Chelmsford, Councillor Janette Potter and the Mayoress, Jackie Galley, who were shown round by the Chairman and enjoyed tea and cakes afterwards! We hope to be able to repeat this event next year.

As usual, Councillor surgeries are on the last Saturday of each month (except August and December) from 10 am – 12 noon in the Galleywood Library, so please come along to meet your Parish Councillors and to discuss local issues. ## A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

#### **Going green**

I love the time of year from May to early-summer. It is my

favourite time of year for enjoying nature. The trees come into full leaf, there are lots of wild flowers around, and there are lots of lovely smells in the air. I don't have a great sense of smell, so if I can smell the flowers they must be good! And of course I love it when the weather starts to get warmer.

In recent years, the Church of England has put lots of time and energy into caring for the environment. This is not just because the planet supports human beings and we want it to remain beautiful, and not just because we don't want our descendants to suffer because of our wasteful actions, but also because the environment has a value of its own. Every bit of the natural world has its own beauty and value even if humans aren't there to enjoy it.

Christians have a good reason for saying this: We believe the environment is something that God has created, and is something that God values. In the book of Genesis in the Bible, in the great parable about the heavens and the earth being made in six days, it says that God declares that creation is "good", and when God created humans he described creation as "very good".

Human beings are part of the creation. We are made from the same physical stuff as everything else. And we are the only creatures who God made in his image, who he has put in charge of the creation.

In other words, we are the creatures with the big brains who can do the most damage and give the most care. Part of being human is to care for God's creation in the way that he does.

St Michael's Church has recently achieved a Silver Eco Church award, which we are very pleased about. We will go for Gold eventually, although that will probably mean changing our heating system which will cost a fortune, so that is a longer-term project. In the meantime, we are continually looking for ways to live more sustainably. This is one of the reasons why the rules for our churchyard, (which are set by the Diocese and are part of English law) say that nothing plastic should be left on graves.

Caring for creation is all of our responsibility. We do this ourselves, and we teach our children to do it also.

I hope you all have a great summer enjoying the natural world!

### **D Day Commemorations**

On 6th June 2024, the country marked the 80th anniversary of the Normandy Landings on 6 June 1944.

Major events were held around the country and the Parish Council decided to mark the occasion by having a commemorative service at the war memorial at Keene Hall.

Reverend David Cattle and Parish Councillors led the service. We were also joined by the Mayor of Chelmsford, Janette Potter and Mayoress Jackie Galley. Extracts and poems from the official anniversary guide were read by councillors and Councillor Neville Paul raised the flag at the Keene hall.

Councillor Gillian Bonnett lit the lamp of peace. The light of the flame represents the 'light of peace' that emerged from the darkness of war. Residents who joined the service were then welcomed into the hall for complimentary refreshments and a chance to talk and meet with fellow residents and Councillors.



### **Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy**

### More than ever, wildlife and their habitats are under threat for survival.

The Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy provides a new vision for our natural spaces and the draft strategy is currently being prepared for public consultation.

Made mandatory in the Environment Act of 2021, the Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) presents a pivotal opportunity for us all to contribute towards a sustainable future for our wildlife and the landscapes they inhabit.

Essex County Council, in collaboration with the Essex Local Nature Partnership, has created the draft Essex LNRS, alongside a range of key local stakeholders, including Supporting Authorities, farmers, landowners, environmental organisations and charities, community groups, parish and town councils and the public. Covering the whole of Greater Essex, the document aims to identify key locations for the creation and enhancement of habitats, focusing on areas that will provide the most significant benefits for nature and the wider environment. By outlining key biodiversity priorities and proposed actions, the aim is to achieve a more connected, collaborative approach to nature recovery. The draft strategy is expected to go to public consultation later this summer.



## Do you live with hearing loss, Hearing or know someone who does? Help Essex

Hearing Help Essex is a Chelmsford based charity, supporting individuals living with hearing loss across Essex.

Many people don't realise that hearing aids need cleaning regularly and that they need retubing every 4-6 months. Our trained Volunteers can assist with essential retubing, cleaning and general hearing aid maintenance for NHS hearing Aid users. We run regular sessions across the county where you book an appointment with one of our volunteers.

If you are unable to attend in person, it is possible for someone else to bring the hearing aids to a support session on your behalf. If you are housebound, please ask about our doorstep service.

We also provide an Information, Advice, and Guidance service, helping to find solutions

to difficulties associated with hearing loss. This service is currently being delivered from our Resource Centre in central Chelmsford, in person, or by phone, video call, text message, or email. Our services are completely free of charge, but as a small charity working hard to support Essex residents living with hearing loss, all donations are appreciated.







## Savouring summer with refreshing recipes for sunny days

### As sunny days continue, there's still time for some refreshing recipes that the season brings.

In this edition, we're excited to share four delightful recipes perfect for late summer entertaining. From a berry-infused cocktail to homemade ice cream and a crisp, flavourful salad, these recipes will add a splash of sunshine to your table. Let's dive into the joys of summer cooking!

#### **BERRY BLISS COCKTAIL**

#### **Ingredients**

150g mixed fresh berries (strawberries, raspberries, blueberries) 1 tablespoon caster sugar 60ml gin 30ml elderflower cordial 150ml soda water Ice cubes

#### Instructions

- 1. In a small bowl, combine the mixed berries and caster sugar. Mash slightly to release the juices and let sit for 10 minutes.
- 2. Fill four glasses with ice cubes.

Fresh mint leaves, to garnish

- **3.** Divide the mashed berries among the glasses.
- **4.** Pour 15ml of gin and 7.5ml of elderflower cordial into each glass.
- **5.** Top with soda water and stir gently to combine.
- **6.** Garnish with fresh mint leaves and a few whole berries.

# 7. Serve the Berry Bliss Cocktail immediately and enjoy the refreshing burst of summer flavours.

#### **HOMEMADE VANILLA ICE CREAM**

#### **Ingredients**

600ml double cream 300ml whole milk 150g caster sugar 1 vanilla pod, split and seeds scraped 6 egg yolks

#### **Instructions**

- In a saucepan, combine the double cream, whole milk, and half of the caster sugar. Add the vanilla pod and seeds. Heat gently until it starts to simmer, then remove from heat and let infuse for 15 minutes.
- 2. In a bowl, whisk the egg yolks with the remaining sugar until pale and thick.
- **3.** Remove the vanilla pod from the cream mixture. Slowly pour the warm cream into the egg yolks, whisking constantly.
- 4. Return the mixture to the saucepan and cook over low heat, stirring continuously until it thickens and coats the back of a spoon.
- **5.** Pour the custard into a bowl, cover with cling film, and chill in the fridge for at least 4 hours.
- **6.** Once chilled, churn the mixture in an ice cream maker according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Transfer the ice cream to a container and freeze for at least 2 hours before serving.
  - Scoop the homemade vanilla ice cream into bowls or cones and enjoy the creamy delight on a hot summer day.

#### **MEDITERRANEAN QUINOA SALAD**



#### **Ingredients**

200g quinoa
1 red pepper, diced
1 yellow pepper, diced
1 cucumber, diced
150g cherry tomatoes, halved
50g black olives, pitted and sliced
100g feta cheese, crumbled
2 tablespoons olive oil
1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
1 teaspoon dried oregano
Salt and pepper, to taste
Fresh parsley, chopped, to garnish

#### Instructions

- Rinse the quinoa under cold water. Place in a saucepan with 500ml of water and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes, or until the water is absorbed and the quinoa is tender. Fluff with a fork and let cool.
- In a large bowl, combine the diced red pepper, yellow pepper, cucumber, cherry tomatoes, black olives, and crumbled feta cheese.
- In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, red wine vinegar, dried oregano, salt, and pepper.
- Add the cooled quinoa to the vegetable mixture and pour over the dressing. Toss gently to combine.
- **5.** Garnish the Mediterranean quinoa salad with chopped fresh parsley.
- Serve the salad chilled or at room temperature for a refreshing and nutritious summer meal.

#### **STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE SUNDAE**



#### **Ingredients**

500g fresh strawberries, hulled and sliced 2 tablespoons caster sugar 1 tablespoon lemon juice 4 scones, halved 600ml vanilla ice cream (recipe above) Whipped cream, to serve

#### Instructions

- In a bowl, combine the sliced strawberries, caster sugar, and lemon juice. Let sit for 10 minutes to macerate.
- Place the scone halves on serving plates or bowls.
- **3.** Scoop vanilla ice cream onto each scone half.
- **4.** Spoon the macerated strawberries over the ice cream.
- **5.** Top with a generous dollop of whipped cream.
- 6. Serve the strawberry shortcake sundaes immediately for a delightful summer dessert that combines the best of seasonal fruit and creamy ice cream.





## What to do in the garden in September

### September is here, and there's plenty to be done while you're outside enjoying the last of the year's warmth.

Harvesting crops will keep you busy this month, and there's plenty of work to do tidying and maintaining plants and equipment.

Read on for a comprehensive list of garden jobs to get on with this month:

#### **Timely Tips**

September isn't the time to take your eye off the ball in the garden. Here are some of the main jobs:

- Divide your herbaceous perennials. This will keep your plants healthy and vigorous year after year and multiply your stock.
- Net ponds now before autumn leaf fall gets underway to reduce the amount of debris entering the water.
- Clean out cold frames and greenhouses ahead of autumn sowing and growing.
- Plant spring-flowering bulbs now, such as daffodils, crocus and hyacinths, for glorious colour next year.
- Keep on top of weeds as they compete with your crops for nutrients and water.

#### In the flower garden



- Continue to feed and deadhead hanging basket and container annuals — they will often keep going until the first frosts.
- Keep deadheading annuals and perennials to extend their performance.
- Prune any late-summer flowering shrubs, such as the rock rose (Helianthemum).
- Prune climbing roses and rambling roses once they've finished flowering (unless they are repeat-flowering varieties, in which case leave them until later in the year).
- Keep camellias and rhododendrons wellwatered at this time of year to ensure that next year's buds develop well.



#### In the vegetable garden



- Start planting garlic sets at the end of the month for cropping next year.
- · Plant autumn onion sets this month.
- Plant out any spring cabbages, like 'Advantage', sown during the summer.
- Pot up some mint and parsley for the kitchen windowsill for fresh herbs through the winter.
- Cover your brassicas with netting to prevent birds making a meal out of them.

#### Looking after your lawn

- Create a new lawn from turf or seed autumn weather is favourable for good lawn establishment.
- Raise the height of your mower blades as grass growth slows down.
- Carry out essential lawn maintenance to avoid waterlogging and compaction. Aerate your lawn with a garden fork, removing thatch from the surface with a rake and repairing dead patches. Use a specialist lawn scarifier if you have a large area to cover.
- Apply a special lawn top-dressing after carrying out maintenance work. Follow the instructions on the packet carefully.
- Feed your lawn with an autumn fertiliser which is rich in potassium and low in nitrogen.
- Control lawn chafers or leatherjackets with a biological control (nematodes).

#### Other jobs about the garden



- Improve clay soil before it becomes too wet or frozen by incorporating organic matter and/or horticultural grit.
- Create compost bins in preparation for all the fallen leaves and dead plant material which you'll be collecting over the coming months.
- Raise pots off the ground for the winter by using bricks or 'pot feet', to prevent waterlogging.
- Install water butts to collect rain this autumn and winter. Rain water is great for watering ericaceous plants such as blueberries, rhododendrons and camellias.



We have club Woods (these were on show) so that new members don't have to purchase any until they are fully comfortable in knowing what suits them.

Beginners get 2 free sessions so they can fully understand what's involved.

We also encouraged our own members to attend, so they themselves can see what else is happening in and about in Galleywood.

Galleywood Parish Council supports the club by providing a grant annually, which is a lifeline to the club for ensuring that the equipment is kept updated.
