



# A message from your Vicar, Rev'd David Cattle

I've done quite a bit of travelling recently.

A member of my close family needed emergency heart surgery in Liverpool, so I have travelled up there a couple of times to be with my family. I went by train, which I think is a great way to travel – I love the feeling of freedom at railway stations, I love seeing the countryside speed past the window, and I get to read a book or do some work on my laptop if need to.

Train journeys can sometimes be difficult, though. It's frustrating when trains are late, or are randomly cancelled at the last minute. On one of my journeys to Liverpool, I sat on a train that was ready to depart, and then the Train Manager announced that the train wasn't going anywhere because of an electrical fault – all the toilet doors were shut and they couldn't get them open! So, we all had to get off the train, walk around Euston station to another platform, and get on another train. And the worse part of train travel, for me, is when you need to endure the dreaded bus replacement service! I was outside Lime Street Station in Liverpool, recently, and there were too many people, too few busses, and too little organisation. It was chaos. In the end, I had to get a bus to a place that was not on my original plan, but at least I could get a train home from there.

The Christmas story involves lots of travelling, and not all of it nice and easy. Joseph and his young pregnant fiancé Mary had to travel from Nazareth in the north of the country to Bethlehem in the south. According to Google Maps, it is a journey of 146 km, and takes about 34 hours if you are walking. Let's hope they really did have a little donkey to carry Mary safely on the way!

The shepherds travelled from the fields around Bethlehem into the town to see the new-born Messiah, Jesus. The appearance of angels in the field must have terrified them, and then they left their sheep (their livelihood) behind. And the wise men came from far in the East, making a difficult and long journey, and stopping at the palace of the murderous King Herod on the way (and having to sneak past him on their way home, in fear for their own lives).

But the most important travelling that happens in the Christmas story is the travelling that God does. He becomes human, in the Person of Jesus Christ, and so he joins us on the journey of life, with all of its ups and downs. Christmas is all about God coming into our world and into our lives, in order to care for us and save us and change the world.



Christmas means that God is always with us. because of his great love for us which goes on into eternity.

I hope you all have a great Christmas, and that you may know the presence of God travelling the journey of life with you.

## **Street Names**

While the new development now known as Beaulieu Park in the north of Chelmsford was under way, Chelmsford Borough (as it was then) Councillors were asked to put forward names of Soldiers who died in World War 1 who had lived in their ward, as possible street names.

Some months earlier Galleywood had at last been able to erect a War Memorial at the front of Keene Hall – organised by Ted Hawkins and Wendy Cummin and funded by public subscriptions – to recognise those who died in both World Wars and other conflicts.

I went to the Galleywood War Memorial and wrote down the names of the men who died in World War 1 and sent the list off to the Borough Council. Later, I was very pleased to be informed that all the names I had put forward had been accepted

Fast forward to this summer and my grandson and his partner contacted me to advise me of the address of the property they had purchased in Beaulieu Park, and lo and behold it was a property in Frank Brazier Road. At the same time the nursing sister in charge of the Special Care Baby Unit at St. John's who looked after my daughter when she was born in November 1983, and with whom I still keep in contact, moved to Galleywood and where to ...Braziers Close.

Quite a coincidence.







# **Teg – The Enviroment Group**


#### We need plants - and they need us.

Plants are amazing things. They take water and nutrients from the ground and pump it up into the green leaves Here the leaves take carbon dioxide from the air and by a process known as photosynthesis they use sunlight to make sugars. These sugars and other chemicals that are sucked up from the ground combine to make food for the growth of the tree. While they are doing this, as a sort of exhaust, they pump out oxygen into the air. Trees also provide cooling through the provision of shade and Evapotranspiration when they release water as a fine mist through their leaves which is particularly effective on a hot dry day.

# **Cosy Dishes to Delight the Family**

# As the chilly winter winds roll in, there's nothing better than a warm, hearty meal to enjoy with family.

In this edition, we're bringing you four comforting recipes that celebrate the best of seasonal flavours. Whether you're craving a rich stew, a savoury bake, or a sweet treat to enjoy by the fire, these dishes are designed to bring warmth and satisfaction to your winter evenings.

#### **HEARTY BEEF AND ROOT VEGETABLE STEW**



#### **Ingredients:**

- 500g diced beef
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- · 2 carrots, sliced
- 2 parsnips, diced
- · 2 potatoes, cubed
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 500ml beef stock
- 1 tablespoon tomato puree
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Fresh parsley, to garnish

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Brown the diced beef on all sides, then remove and set aside.
- 2. In the same pot, add the chopped onion and garlic, cooking until softened.
- 3. Add the carrots, parsnips, and potatoes, cooking for a further 5 minutes.
- Stir in the tomato puree and dried thyme.
   Pour in the beef stock and return the browned beef to the pot.
- 5. Bring the stew to a simmer, cover, and cook on low heat for 1.5 to 2 hours, until the beef is tender and the vegetables are soft.
- Season with salt and pepper, garnish with fresh parsley, and serve hot with crusty bread.

#### **CHEESY LEEK AND POTATO BAKE**



#### **Ingredients:**

- 4 large potatoes, thinly sliced
- 2 leeks, thinly sliced
- 200ml double cream
- 100ml milk
- 150g grated cheddar cheese
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon butter
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Fresh chives, chopped, to garnish

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan).
- 2. In a frying pan, melt the butter and sauté the sliced leeks and garlic until soft. Set aside.
- Grease a baking dish and arrange half of the sliced potatoes in an even layer at the bottom.
- Spoon half of the leek mixture over the potatoes, then sprinkle with a third of the grated cheese.
- 5. Repeat with the remaining potatoes, leeks, and another third of the cheese.
- Pour the cream and milk evenly over the top, season with salt and pepper, and finish with the remaining cheese.
- Cover the dish with foil and bake for 40 minutes. Remove the foil and bake for an additional 20 minutes, until golden and bubbling.
- 8. Garnish with fresh chives and serve.

# ROASTED BUTTERNUT SQUASH AND SAGE RISOTTO



#### **Ingredients:**

- 300g arborio rice
- 1 medium butternut squash, peeled and cubed
- · 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1.2L vegetable stock
- 50g butter
- · 50g Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 6 fresh sage leaves
- · Salt and pepper, to taste

#### **Instructions:**

- Preheat the oven to 200°C (180°C fan). Toss the butternut squash cubes in olive oil, season with salt and pepper, and roast for 25-30 minutes until tender.
- In a large pan, melt half the butter over medium heat and sauté the onion and garlic until softened.
- 3. Stir in the arborio rice and cook for 2 minutes until the grains are coated.
- Gradually add the vegetable stock, one ladle at a time, stirring constantly and allowing the liquid to absorb before adding more. Continue for about 18-20 minutes until the rice is cooked.
- 5. Stir in the roasted butternut squash, remaining butter, and grated Parmesan.

  Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- Fry the sage leaves in a little olive oil until crispy and use to garnish the risotto before serving.

#### SPICED APPLE CRUMBLE



#### **Ingredients:**

- 4 large cooking apples, peeled, cored, and sliced
- 100g caster sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 150g plain flour
- 100g cold unsalted butter, cubed
- 75g brown sugar
- 50g rolled oats
- · Vanilla ice cream or custard, to serve

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan).
- 2. In a large bowl, toss the sliced apples with the caster sugar, ground cinnamon, and nutmeg. Transfer to a baking dish.
- In another bowl, rub the cubed butter into the plain flour until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the brown sugar and rolled oats.
- 4. Sprinkle the crumble topping evenly over the apples.
- 5. Bake for 35-40 minutes, until the topping is golden and the apples are bubbling.
- Serve warm with vanilla ice cream or custard for a perfect autumnal dessert.

These warming recipes are ideal for making the most of winter's cosy nights and seasonal produce. Whether it's a hearty stew or a comforting bake, these dishes will fill your home with delicious aromas and keep the family satisfied!



# What to do in the garden in December

# December is a quiet month in the garden, but there are more things to take care of than you might think.

With limited daylight hours as we approach the shortest day of the year, this month's crisp wintery weather can be strikingly beautiful and bitterly cold in equal measure.

Here's a checklist of jobs that will keep you busy...

#### LOOKING AFTER YOUR LAWN

- Avoid walking on your lawn when it's blanketed by heavy frost or snow, as this damages the grass.
- If it's a mild winter, continue to cut the lawn as it grows, but raise the height of the mower blades.
- Spike lawns with a garden fork to improve drainage and aeration.
- Keep clearing leaves off the lawn to let the light in and prevent dead patches appearing.

#### OTHER JOBS ABOUT THE GARDEN

- Wash down all of your garden tools and give them a wipe of linseed oil on the wooden and metal areas to help prevent rusting.
- Choose a dry day to clear out the garden shed in preparation for the spring.
- Plant bare root edible hedging now while the plant is dormant.
- Check the security of your shed. This is particularly important in winter when you visit it less often.
- Repair fences and apply a wood preservative to prevent them from rotting.
- There's still time to clean out water butts before they fill with fresh rain water over winter.

- Get rid of slimy patches on the patio and paving by scrubbing with a broom or blasting with a pressure washer. For an easy alternative try a liquid patio cleaner.
- Check tree ties and stakes to ensure that trees are still secure following strong autumn winds. Tighten or loosen ties as necessary.
- Wash and disinfect bird feeders and bird tables. Clean out bird baths too.
- Hang fat balls and keep bird feeders topped up with wild bird food to attract birds, who will in turn eat pests in your garden.
- Build or buy a compost bin. Continue to collect fallen leaves and add to leaf bins or the compost heap to rot down.
- After pruning fruit trees use the twigs for pea sticks or shred them for your compost bin.
- Turn your compost heaps to mix the ingredients and help the contents to decompose.
- Cover compost bins with a piece of old carpet or some plastic sheeting to prevent the compost becoming too cold and wet to rot down.
- Make a pile of old logs in an undisturbed corner of the garden to provide shelter for toads and other wildlife.
- Collect brightly-coloured stems and berries for your Christmas decorations.
- Did you know the colourful wrappers of Quality Street sweets are compostable? They're made from cellulose, derived from wood pulp, so rather than chuck them in the bin, add them to your compost heap!

#### IN THE FLOWER GARDEN

- Start to winter-prune wisteria, cutting back whippy summer side-shoots to 2 or 3 buds.
   Favourites like Wisteria sinensis will look tidy and flower better after a good shaping.
- Prune climbing roses now, removing diseased or damaged growth and tying in any new shoots to their support. Prune older flowered side shoots back by two thirds of their length.

- Plant deciduous, climbing honeysuckle now, but make sure to avoid any frozen or waterlogged ground.
- Prune your Japanese maple trees (Acer palmatum) if needed, as they will bleed sap if pruning is done any later.
- Leave the faded flower heads on your hydrangeas until spring, as they provide frost protection to the swelling buds further down the stems.
- If any of your rose bushes suffered from blackspot or rust during the summer, gather up and remove any fallen leaves still on the ground to reduce the chance of spreading the infection next year.
- Keep checking over stored dahlia tubers, keeping an eye out for rot.
- Move containers of shrubs or bedding planters to sheltered spots; clustering them together helps protect the root systems from frost damage.
- Check climbers and climbing shrubs are securely attached to their supports with ties.
- Harvest holly with berries for making Christmas garlands and wreaths. Stand the berry covered twigs in a bucket of water until you're ready to use them.
- Take root cuttings of oriental poppies and grow them on in cold frames.
- Take hardwood cuttings from suitable trees and shrubs.
- Spread fresh gravel or grit around alpine & rockery plants.

#### IN THE VEGETABLE GARDEN


- Lift your last leeks and parsnips before the soil becomes frozen, and heel them into a trench beside a convenient path. They'll keep for several months like this and can be easily brought indoors when required.
- Remove yellowing leaves from your winter brassicas — they're no use to the plant and may harbour pests and diseases.
- If you haven't already, cut down dead asparagus foliage and the top growth of Jerusalem artichokes. Order your asparagus crowns now for planting in spring.
- Dig over empty borders and pile well rotted manure on top - let the worms and frosts break up the clods of soil.
- Dig a trench for next year's beans, fill it with compostable kitchen waste (not cooked food) and re-cover with soil. This will rot down and dramatically improve the growing conditions.

Cover winter brassicas with netting to protect them from pigeons.
