

INSPIRING WOMEN

Take your doggy bag home

Galleywood offers local residents and visitors a variety of pleasant walks in the surrounding open countryside, with several routes on Galleywood Common, around Chelmer Park and in the smaller Jubilee Park.

Sadly it has been noticed recently that there has been a significant increase in dog fouling. This is particularly apparent on our pavements with a few dog walkers not acting responsibly in relation to clearing up after their dogs.

Many readers in Galleywood will be dog lovers but there are a few irresponsible dog owners walking in our village, who are not carrying out their legal duty to take dog waste home with them and are either not clearing up after their dogs or are disposing of the bags inappropriately.

Dog walkers are invited by Chelmsford City Council to sign up to their Green Dog Walkers Group. Members receive free dog poo bags and arm bands or badges indicating membership so that fellow dog walkers can identify them and ask for a free bag if they need one.

It is not at all pleasant for volunteers and council workers strimming verges and long grass to be sprayed with dog poo and or to have to remove bags of dog waste that have been left hanging in trees. Estimates of the number of dogs in the UK vary between 8 and 12 million – that's a lot of dog waste every day and councils are responsible for making sure that public areas are kept clean. Dog owners who do not pick up waste in public areas can be fined up to £100. If the fine is not paid, the offending dog owners can be taken to Court and given larger fines.

Galleywood has a number of dedicated dog waste bins. However, if there is no dedicated dog waste bin, any public general waste bin can be used if dog waste has been securely bagged and tied, preferably in a compostable bag. It's not just because of the nasty task of cleaning dog poo off your shoes. There are risks to health from dog mess, the main one being toxocariasis, which mostly affects young children who may come into contact with infected soil with very serious consequences. Children walking to and from school, parents pushing prams and buggies with toddlers and older residents with visual impairments are most impacted. Infected dog waste can also pass worms and parasites to sheep and cattle with perilous consequences.

Despite signs being erected advising of the penalties to owners allowing their dogs to foul in our village there has recently been a steep increase in offences committed.

The Council asks dog owners to help as follows:

- Keep your dog wormed
- Always pick up after your dog and encourage others to do the same
- Use environmentally friendly poo bags
- Carry an extra bag with you to offer to other dog walkers.

So please do help us to keep Galleywood clean by ensuring that you remember to clean up after your dog and pass this message on to others as well.



Galleywood Cottage Garden Society

As we emerge from long winter evenings, it's the time of year many of us start to address plans and goals that have been fostered for the year ahead.



Walking around Galleywood, it is clear that many are interested in growing and the allotments, front gardens and our Common are examples of people and nature beavering away to make our locality all the more pleasant. I imagine I am not alone when I hopefully drool over seed catalogues, despite a not insignificant store of little packets waiting expectantly to be released that I already have in cool spots throughout my house.

However, few gardeners can resist ordering a few old favourite varieties alongside some tempting new varieties with the promise of prize-worthy rewards for my efforts.

Your local allotments in Chaplin Close have been cultivated for over 100 years and the connectedness that gives us to those who have gardened before is palpable. Alongside this the sense of being in touch with nature and our local environment plot holders meet others with a shared passion. Plot-holders are frequently rewarded with a great sense of achievement and relaxation. The benefits to our bodies and minds is well documented and so there is much on offer at many levels.

Chaplain Close has two sized plots with costing just £17.50 and £35.00 annually and therefore is accessible to a wide range of budgets. Our creative plot holders uniquely plant a variety of fruit, flowers and vegetables filling our households and those of friends and family.

During the winter months we've been enjoying parsnip soups and my harvest is confined to retrieving pickles and jams made earlier in the year. Several plot holders however relish Christmas dinner with homegrown Brussels, carrots and parsnips.



A message from your Vicar, Revd David Cattle

What kind of world do we want to live in?

I've been doing a lot of thinking about this question recently. I don't much like the state of the world at the moment. Yes, things have been a lot worse at various points in the past, but today doesn't fill me with joy, and I know a lot of people are anxious. But how would we want the world to look? And, if Jesus was here today, what kind of world would he want? Looking at the stories about him in the four Gospels in the Bible, I can suggest a few things:

It would be a world where people genuinely and deeply care about each other – not just those in those in our family or group or tribe, but everyone; where people care about the prosperity and flourishing of all, instead of competing with each other, and grasping everything we can for ourselves and keeping others in poverty so that we can have our luxuries; where we have individual freedoms but also consider the needs of others; where leaders speak

with grace and care about others rather than belittling them; where we speak the truth in love, rather than twisting everything for our own gain; where there is justice for all and no-one is above the law, regardless of how rich or powerful they are; where love not fear is the primary human motivation; where we take especial care of the most vulnerable people (because they need it); where we learn to trust each other; where we spend more on education than we do on warfare; where social media posting is fair, gracious and informed, and seeks to build up rather than tear down: where we live sustainably on the Earth (we might be going to Mars, but the scenery and the air are much better right here!).

We might feel rather powerless to create a world like this.

The forces of fear and self-interest seem just too big. And yet the Christian Gospel is a message of hope: God raised Jesus from the dead 2,000 years ago, which means that he will put the world right and heal every wound. This might be hard to believe right now, but it's always been hard to believe. Like in the Psalms in the Bible, the prayers of ancient Israel that Jesus himself would have said, we might want to ask God "how long will you let this evil go on for?" or even "would you just wake up and do something!"

Waiting on God's timing is painful, but there are things that we can do in the

meantime. We can pray, as the Psalms encourage us to do, even anguished prayers that blame God for everything. We can vote (I only have one vote, but it is a little of power to build the world I want to see). And we can work. Christianity was never about people sitting around and waiting

for God to fix everything; it was always about telling us that WE need to make a difference in the world around us.

Let these dark, scary days inspire us to work harder to be people of kindness and generosity to everyone we meet. Because that's how we build a better world – one kind act at a time.

Mayor Tree Planting in Galleywood Cllr Janette Potter has planted a tree to mark her year in office as the Mayor of Chelmsford.



She chose to plant a Callery pear tree (flowering pear) on Pipers Tye in her city council ward of Galleywood.

On the 2nd December, Cllr Rose Moore, Cabinet Member for a Greener Chelmsford, gave a welcome speech in which she shared more about this special species of tree:

"Today we are planting a Pyrus calleryana 'Chanticleer', also known as the Callery pear, to celebrate Cllr Potter's term as Mayor of Chelmsford.

"This species of tree is considered one of the most successful cultivars of pear. It has healthy, glossy green leaves that remain on the tree until autumn and then turn a lovely burnished yellow with red tints. When the tree blooms in spring it does so in abundance, with striking white flowers that attract our vital pollinators. The Callery pear thrives on most soil types, tolerates air pollution and provides shelter for birds and insects, making it a wonderful addition to this green space for many years to come."

Recipes for Cosy Nights in

From sweet treats to savoury delights, they're packed with heartwarming flavours. Whether you're preparing a romantic dinner or flipping pancakes with the kids, these easy and delicious dishes are guaranteed to impress.

Classic Pancakes with Lemon and Sugar



Ingredients:

- 125g plain flour
- 2 large eggs
- 250ml semi-skimmed milk
- 1 tablespoon sunflower oil (plus extra for frying)
- Pinch of salt
- Lemon wedges and caster sugar, to serve

Instructions:

- 1. In a mixing bowl, sift the flour and add the salt. Make a well in the centre, crack in the eggs, and gradually whisk in the milk to form a smooth batter.
- 2. Heat a non-stick frying pan over medium heat and add a small amount of oil.
- 3. Pour a ladle of batter into the pan, swirling it around to create a thin, even layer. Cook for 1-2 minutes until golden, then flip and cook the other side.
- 4. Repeat with the remaining batter.
- 5. Serve warm with a sprinkle of sugar and a squeeze of fresh lemon juice.

Gorgeous Garlic and Herb Butter Steak



Ingredients:

- 4 sirloin steaks (200g each)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- · 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 50g unsalted butter
- 1 tablespoon fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves
- Salt and pepper, to taste

Instructions:

- 1. Season the steaks with salt and pepper on both sides.
- Heat the olive oil in a large frying pan over high heat. Add the steaks and sear for 2-3 minutes on each side for medium-rare (adjust to your preferred doneness). Remove and rest on a plate.
- Lower the heat to medium and add butter, garlic, parsley, and thyme to the pan. Stir until the butter melts and becomes fragrant.
- 4. Drizzle the herb butter over the rested steaks and serve with a side of roasted vegetables or mashed potatoes.



Hearty Beef and Red Wine Stew



Ingredients:

- · 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 500g diced beef
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 carrots, sliced
- 2 celery sticks, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 tablespoons plain flour
- 200ml red wine
- 400ml beef stock
- 1 tablespoon tomato purée
- 2 bay leaves
- Salt and pepper, to taste

Instructions:

- 1. Heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a casserole pot. Brown the beef in batches, then set aside.
- 2. Add the remaining oil, onion, carrots, celery, and garlic to the pot. Cook until softened.
- 3. Stir in the flour and cook for 1 minute. Add the wine, scraping the bottom of the pot, then stir in the stock, tomato purée, bay leaves, and browned beef.
- 4. Cover and simmer on low heat for 1.5-2 hours, stirring occasionally, until the beef is tender.
- 5. Serve hot with crusty bread or creamy mash.

Decadent Chocolate Fondant



Ingredients:

- 100g dark chocolate (70% cocoa), chopped
- 100g unsalted butter, plus extra for greasing
- 100g icing sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 2 large egg yolks
- 50g plain flour

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200°C (180°C fan). Grease 4 ramekins with butter and dust with cocoa powder.
- Melt the chocolate and butter together in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water, stirring until smooth. Remove from the heat and cool slightly.
- In a separate bowl, whisk the icing sugar, eggs, and egg yolks until pale and thick. Gradually fold in the melted chocolate mixture, then sift in the flour and fold gently.
- 4. Divide the batter between the ramekins and bake for 10-12 minutes until the edges are set but the centre is still soft.
- 5. Serve immediately with a scoop of vanilla ice cream or a dusting of icing sugar.

We might be in the shortest month of the year, but it's filled with opportunities to create lasting memories in the kitchen. From savouring a romantic steak dinner to flipping pancakes, these recipes are perfect for celebrating the special moments the coming months has to offer. 
